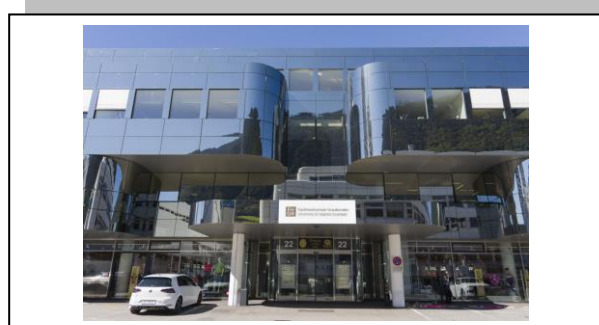

<b>VISA &amp; RESIDENCE PERMIT</b>	
Visa	<p>Citizens from countries outside of the EU/EFTA require an entry visa for Switzerland. The application process takes up to 3 months. The costs for the Visa are paid for by the student. The standard documents required for visa application are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Passport (valid for min. 6 months beyond the student's stay)</li> <li>- Letter of acceptance from University of Applied Sciences of the Grisons</li> <li>- Language diploma (IELTS or TOEFL, etc.)</li> <li>- Evidence of sufficient funds for your stay in Switzerland</li> <li>- Health &amp; accident insurance policy for Switzerland</li> </ul> <p>Refer to the website of the Swiss Embassy/Consulate for country-specific requirements: <a href="http://www.eda.admin.ch/eda/en/home/rebs.html">http://www.eda.admin.ch/eda/en/home/rebs.html</a></p>
Residence permit	<p>All students are required to have a residence permit for their stay in Switzerland. The international office applies for such permits on arrival in Switzerland. The costs for the residence permit are paid for by the student.</p>
Work permits & regulations	<p>Non-EU students are <u>not</u> permitted to work in Switzerland.</p> <p>EU students are permitted to work up to <u>15 hrs per week</u>. A work permission letter must be applied for in addition by the employer.</p>
<b>ACCOMMODATION</b>	
General information	<p>Once a student has been offered an exchange place, please contact the International Office about the housing preferences. Currently, these are the options available to exchange students:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Student residence Konvikt (limited spaces available). Reservations managed by the International Office</li> <li>2. Flat-share platform: <a href="http://www.fhgr.ch/wohnungsboerse">http://www.fhgr.ch/wohnungsboerse</a></li> <li>3. The International office can put students in contact with Swiss outgoing exchange students who rent out their room in a shared flat whilst they are abroad.</li> </ol>

## INSURANCE

### Health and accident insurance

Health & accident insurance is **mandatory** for everybody who is residing in Switzerland.

#### EU/EFTA students:

Students living in the EU and holding **public health insurance** must send us a copy of their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) as proof of health insurance coverage. The EHIC must be valid for the entire duration of stay in Switzerland.

#### Non-EU/EFTA students:

Students without the European health insurance card have the following options:

1. Sign up for Swiss insurance policy through the International Office. The basic monthly premium costs are approx. CHF 350.- (depending on age, gender and domicile).
2. Sign up for a Swiss insurance policy directly with Swiss insurance companies specializing in health and accident insurance for foreign students, e.g.: [www.swisscare.ch](http://www.swisscare.ch) (monthly premiums starting from CHF 65.--)
3. Health insurance provider in home country signs an exemption form, confirming that the foreign insurance policy offers equivalent coverage to the Swiss KVG basic health insurance benefits. This application will be evaluated by local authorities on arrival in Chur.

### Personal liability insurance

Exchange students are requested to purchase a personal liability insurance. This covers damages to other persons and property caused by the policy holder. Before students leave their home country, they should check with the insurer whether the insurance covers liability whilst living abroad.

The University of Applied Sciences of the Grisons accepts no liability for students.

## NON-ACADEMIC INFORMATION

### Estimated costs of living

Approx. CHF 1'500 per month

### Buddy system

Each exchange student is allocated a Swiss "buddy" to help them with daily life and social integration.

### Students and staff with disabilities
