Estimated Semester Dates	Fall/winter semester: usually from mid-September until mid-February Spring/summer semester: usually from mid-February until early July
Application Requirements and Procedure	STEP 1: Apply to the International Office of SRH Hochschule Berlin in order to be nominated for a place at uni.lu. The deadline is the end of March prior to the academic year you wish to go abroad. STEP 2: Once you received your official nomination letter, you will need to apply to uni.lu. Check http://www.uni.lu/students/mobility/incoming_exchange_students/admission_and_online_registration to familiarize yourself with the application process and also with the admission requirements to determine whether or not you qualify for admission. (Some partner universities only accept students with a grade average of 2.0 or better, others may require you to have a minimum TOEFL score or may have other admission criteria.)
Language of Instruction of Cooperating Department	Most study programs are multilingual (English/French/German), but you may select only those courses that are taught in the language(s) that you are fluent in. For more details on the language of instruction recommendations, see the course catalogue of each program.
Minimum Language Skills	B2 (but higher level recommended) – Please note that your language skill level is directly related to your academic success. Even if you fulfil the minimum language requirement, you are advised to further improve your language skills before the beginning of your semester abroad.
