Application Requirements and Procedure	STEP 1: First of all, find out about Yale University on the following websites: YSS/ELI/IVY: http://summer.yale.edu/apply/international-students Yale's Online Summer Session: http://summer.yale.edu/academics/important-information-summer-online#toc6 Students must include proof at the time of application for Yale that they have sufficient financial resources to meet the tuition and living expenses of Yale Summer Session. STEP 2: Make an appointment with the International Office and discuss with them how a stay at Yale University can look like and what the exact application process looks like.
Language of Instruction of Cooperating Department	English
Minimum Language Skills	YSS/ IVY and online classes: TOEFL ibt 100, TOEFL ppt 600, TOEFL ibt 200 or IELTS 7.0 with scores being no older than 2 years (In lieu of a test score, students may submit alternative evidence of English language proficiency, such as proof of attendance for at least three years at a secondary school where English is the primary language of instruction.)

	<p>ELI: A TOEFL test is not required, but you should be speaking English at an intermediate to advanced level (advanced level required for some ELI classes). Students in the Intensive English program will be given an English placement test to determine your level of study. Students in other programs will be assessed on the first day as well.</p>
