## Preconditions for application

- There should be an inter-institutional agreement between the home university and Inholland University of Applied Sciences.
- Courses are taught in English. Inholland does no longer ask students to upload a proof of English proficiency. It is assumed nominated students have at least English B2 level, as agreed with the partner universities.



## Application procedure

Students have to be nominated by the international coordinator from their home university in order to apply for the exchange programme at Inholland University of Applied Sciences.

<b>Language of instruction</b>	Courses are taught in English. Inholland requires exchange students to have at least B2 level of English.

<b>Sport facilities</b>	There are no sport facilities on the campuses, but you can find sport and health clubs nearby.



## Visa

Some students need a long-stay visa (MVV) and/or a residence permit (VVR). Inholland will apply for this on behalf of the student. ## Accommodation

Unfortunately, there is a shortage when it comes to student housing in the Netherlands. Students should start arranging their accommodation as early as possible (at least four months in advance). The rent price for student accommodation in the Netherlands is between €400 and 900 per month. Most students in the Netherlands live in shared student housing.

Most Inholland locations have a limited number of rooms available for exchange students. However, in Rotterdam there are [no rooms available](#).

Since we work on a first-come-first-serve basis, we recommend students to apply for the available rooms once they receive an e-mail from us about the housing application.

## Studying with a disability or personal circumstances

After the Dutch government ratified the UN Convention on Disability in 2016, the amended Equal Treatment of Chronically Ill and Disabled Persons Act came into force on 1 January 2017. This means that all buildings with a public function (public buildings, government buildings but also shops and restaurants) must be accessible, or adjustments must be made to become accessible, regardless of one's disability or chronic illness. This makes accessibility the norm in the Netherlands and inaccessibility the exception. Inholland is of course committed to this principle and offers, to the best of her abilities, facilities to students with physical disabilities. So if you come study with us and want to discuss your needs, please let us know before you arrive here and contact the student counsellor.

The student counsellor can assist you if personal circumstances are preventing you from giving your education the attention it needs. Whether this is due to illness, family matters, dyslexia, any other disability or something else - they are happy to discuss how our university can make things easier for you. Together we come up with realistic goals to make your life as a student easier and help you succeed in your studies. If you would like to discuss your personal situation before you sign up as a student at Inholland, please contact the International Office and they will get you in touch with the student counsellor of the Inholland location you are planning to study at.

- Health Insurance
  - **EU/EEA students** must obtain an European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) pre-arrival. Be aware that this card expires after a few weeks/months. Contact your health insurance to apply for a new card that is valid during your entire exchange.
  - **Non EU/EEA students** need to take out an Insurance Passport for Students (AON). In case Inholland applies for your Visa or Residence Permit, the admissions department will take out the AON insurance on your behalf. Be aware that this insurance is taken out usually from 1 September. Before that date, even if you travel to the Netherlands sooner, you are responsible to have your own health insurance!   - **Working:** if you have a job in the Netherlands, you need a [Dutch Basic Health Insurance](#).
- **Liability Insurance:** we highly recommend all students to take out a liability insurance as well.
