



The MSc Programme in Economics and Management is designed for high profile students who want to operate in the fields of business and institutional management.









### **Transfers**

From Airport to Roma Termini station (city centre)

From centre to University

From Roma Fiumicino Airport (Leonardo Da Vinci airport): both by train and bus.

From Roma Ciampino Airport: both by train (with a change in Ciampino station) and bus.
